



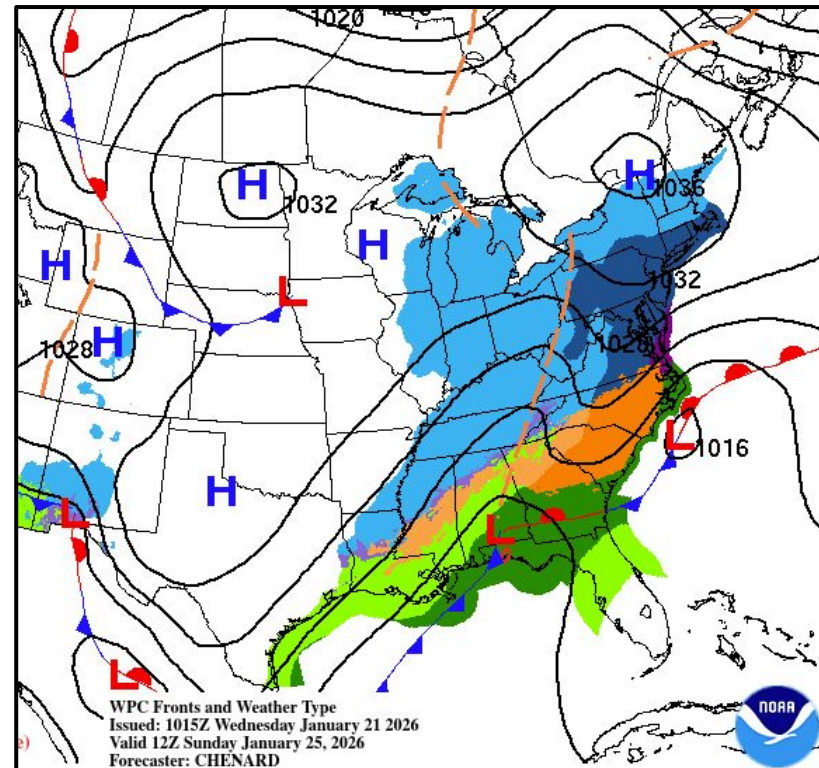
# Storm Possible Sunday Night - Monday (1/25 - 1/26)

January 21, 2026  
1445 UTC

**CALL TO ACTION:** Vessels planning to be in the area should execute avoidance plans.

## KEY MESSAGES:

- Low pressure should gradually strengthen and broaden off of the east coast Sunday into Monday.
- As the low moves east, storm-force sustained winds are possible, currently with the better chances to start Sunday night in and near the Gulf Stream east of 68W.
- Depending on the strength and track of the low, areas of storm-force sustained winds could occur again Monday especially north of 36N and east of 70W.
- Mariners should monitor later forecasts on the track and strength of the low, and the exact impacts to areas off of the east coast.
- Avoidance plans may eventually be needed depending on the voyage planned and the vessel's cargo.
- By Tuesday afternoon, areas of light-to-moderate freezing spray could occur as far south as off of the mid-Atlantic coast.
